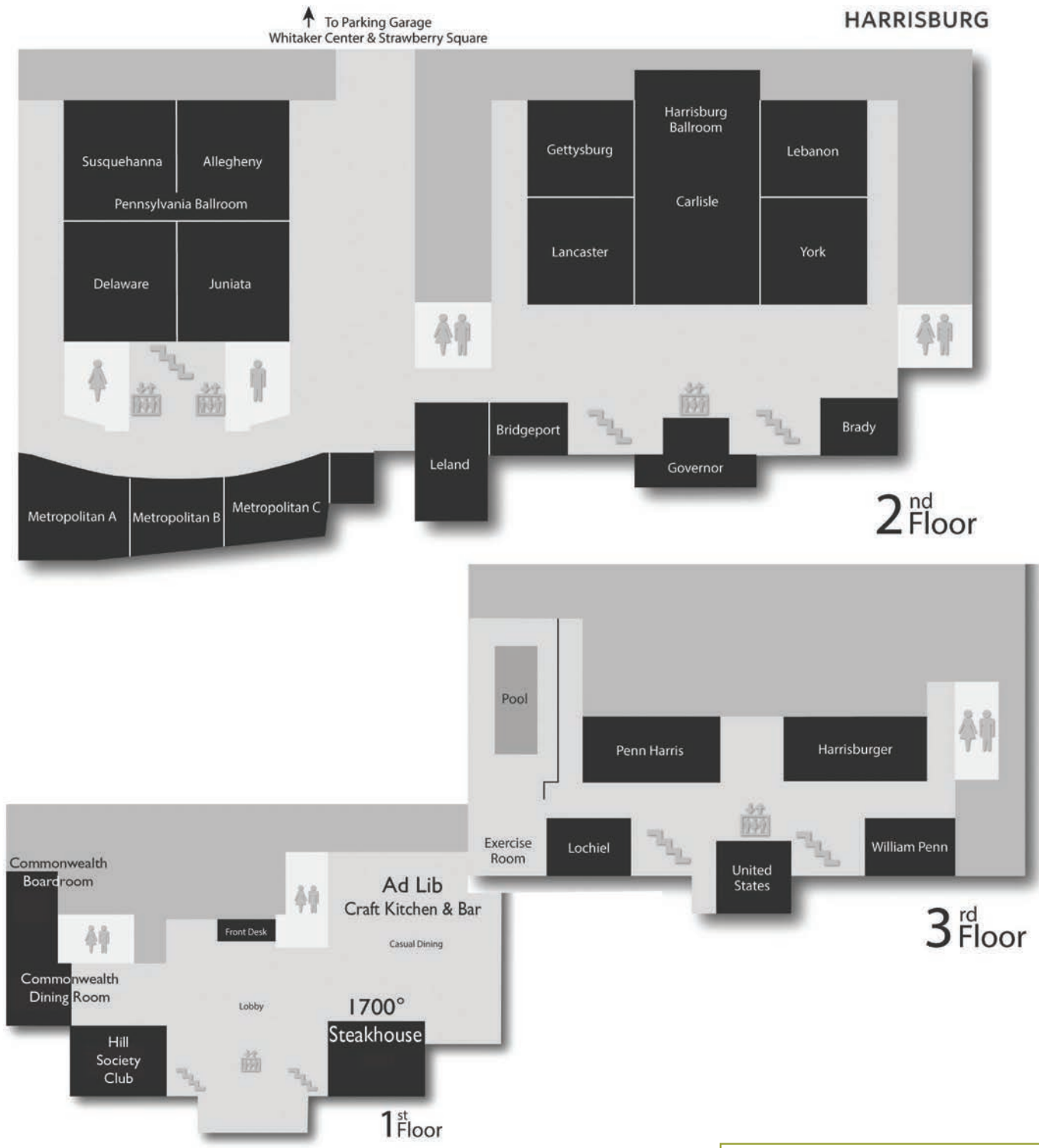

RECREATION WITHIN REACH

Starting point: Harrisburg Hilton. Sites arranged by distance, shortest to longest.

STRAWBERRY SQUARE (320 MARKET STREET)

.1 mile (~3-minute walk)

Strawberry Square, in the heart of downtown Harrisburg, is a mixed-use hub featuring shops, dining, offices, schools, and community events — all centered around its signature atrium.

CAPITAL AREA GREENBELT AT RIVERFRONT PARK (200 S FRONT STREET)

.3 miles (~7-minute walk)

The trail is a 20-mile loop through and around Harrisburg. It passes along the Susquehanna River through Riverfront Park, through wooded areas, urban offices, residential areas, and scenic parks, including Reservoir Park and Wildwood Park. A majority of the trail is on dedicated paths with parts on local roads. The trail is a mixture of paved, gravel, and crushed stone.

PENNSYLVANIA STATE CAPITOL COMPLEX AT CAPITOL PARK (NORTH 3RD STREET)

.4 miles (~9-minute walk)

The Pennsylvania State Capitol Complex is comprised of the buildings owned by the Commonwealth and are centered around the capitol in Harrisburg. The Pennsylvania Capitol Grounds, officially named Capitol Park, comprises more than forty-five acres.

SOLDIER'S GROVE (531 COMMONWEALTH AVENUE)

.5 miles (~11-minute walk)

Behind the Capitol, Soldiers Grove serves as the site of Pennsylvania's Medal of Honor Memorial. The memorial records the names of recipients from different eras, beginning with the Civil War, and is also home to a marker honoring the United States Colored Troops Grand Review.

CITY ISLAND VIA WALNUT STREET BRIDGE

.6 miles (~15-minute walk)

The 63-acre island is a true gem of the Susquehanna River — the perfect place to relax, play, and take in sweeping views of the river and Harrisburg's skyline.

RESERVOIR PARK (100 CONCERT DRIVE)

1.7 miles (~45-minute walk)

Reservoir Park, Harrisburg's oldest and largest municipal park, spans eighty-five acres atop Allison Hill. Perched at the city's highest point, it offers panoramic views of the Capitol, Susquehanna River Valley, and Blue Mountains. Established in 1890, it houses the National Civil War Museum, vital city reservoirs, the Capital Area Greenbelt, community festivals, and the Chutes and Ladders playground.

ITALIAN LAKE (DIVISION STREET)

2.5 miles (~56-minute walk)

Located in Uptown Harrisburg, Italian Lake is a beautiful human-made lake surrounded by walking paths, public seating and even an outdoor concert venue.

HARRISBURG ARTS DISTRICT (VARIOUS LOCATIONS)

Harrisburg's cultural heartbeat thrives in its museums, murals, galleries, theaters, and performance spaces — all connected within the walkable Harrisburg Arts District, which spans parts of downtown, midtown, and the riverfront.

Trails as Lifelines: Advocacy in Action for a Connected Future

Julie Judkins leads a consulting practice dedicated to regenerating nature and communities through the power of trails. She develops programs that mobilize people as land stewards and advises communities and organizations worldwide on inclusive trail design, engagement, and management. In North Carolina, Julie coordinates the Great State Trails Coalition, advocating for statewide investment in trails. Previously, she led education and outreach at the Appalachian Trail Conservancy, creating award-winning youth and community initiatives. She also serves on the boards of the Partnership for the National Trails System and the World Trails Network, and maintains trails with the Carolina Mountain Club.
